 - (i) the organization of the work of the General Conference and Executive Board, including that of their Commissions and Committees;
 - (ii) the Report of the Director-General on the Activities of the Organization, prepared in accordance with Article VI 3 (b) of the Constitution;
 - (iii) studies in depth, assessment, or elaboration of methods of evaluation, of selected aspects of programme execution;
 - (iv) relations with the United Nations Joint Inspection Unit, and consideration of reports prepared by the Joint Inspection Unit which are not referred to the Commission of the Board.

7.2 Terms of reference of the Committee on Conventions and Recommendations

The Executive Board,

1. Recalling 96 EX/Decision 8.2, in which it established a Committee on Conventions and Recommendations in Education and laid down its terms of reference,
2. Recalling 98 EX/ Decisions 9.4, 9.5, 9.6, in which it redefined the terms of reference of the said Committee,
3. Recalling 101 EX/Decision 8.2, in which it confirmed those terms of reference,
4. Recalling 104 EX/Decision 3.3, in which it decided that the Committee would henceforth be designated "the Committee on Conventions and Recommendations", and established the conditions and procedures for consideration of the communications received by the Organization concerning cases and questions of violations of human rights with in Unesco's fields of competence,

7.3 Terms of reference of the Committee on International Non-Governmental Organizations

The Executive Board,

1. Recognizing the importance of the role of the international non-governmental organizations maintaining relations with Unesco in the preparation and implementation of the Organization's programme,
2. Recalling that the purposes of the relations between Unesco and the international non-governmental organizations are defined in paragraphs 2 and 3 of the preamble to the Directives concerning Unesco's relations with international non-governmental organizations,
3. Taking into account the following resolutions adopted by the General Conference:
 - (a) 19 C/Resolution 12. 1: "Unesco's contribution to peace and its tasks with respect to the promotion of human rights and the elimination of colonialism and racialism; long-term programme of measures whereby Unesco can contribute to the strengthening of peace";
 - (b) 21 C/Resolution 7/34 concerning Unesco's co-operation with international non-governmental organizations;
 - (c) 21 C/Resolution 7/35 concerning international non-governmental organizations maintaining relations with Unesco and in which bodies or individuals from Taiwan still participate in the name of China;
4. Decides to establish a Committee on International Non-Governmental Organizations of 14 members with the following terms of reference:
 - (a) to carry out, in accordance with the periodicity established by the Executive Board at its 61st session (61 EX/Decision 15.2, II), studies of new applications for admission to consultative status (categories A and B) and for changes in category;
 - (b) to examine all other questions concerning international non-governmental organizations which the Executive Board may refer to it for study and advice.

8.1.1 Invitations to the International Conference on Hydrology and on the scientific bases for the rational management of water resources (111 EX/2)

1. Having considered the Director-General's proposals concerning invitations to the International Conference on Hydrology and on the scientific bases for the rational management of water resources (111 EX/2),

2. Decides:

- (a) that invitations to the Conference shall be extended to all Member States and the Associate Member of Unesco under the conditions laid down in paragraph 5 of document 111 EX/2;
- (b) that the non-Member States listed in paragraph 7 of document 111 EX/2 shall be invited to send observers to the Conference;
- (c) that invitations to send observers to the Conference shall be extended to the African liberation movements recognized by the Organization of African Unity;
- (d) that an invitation to send observers to the Conference shall be extended to the Palestine Liberation Organization recognized by the League of Arab States;
- (e) that invitations to be represented at the Conference shall be extended to the international organizations listed in paragraph 10 (a) of document 111 EX/2, to the Organisation pour la mise en valeur du fleuve Gambie and to the Lake Chad Basin Commission;
- (f) that the international organizations listed in paragraph 10 (b) of document 111 EX/2 shall be invited to send observers to the Conference.

8.2.1 Invitations to the Intergovernmental Regional Meeting on the Objectives, Strategies and Methods of Action for a Major Project in the Field of Education in the Latin American and Caribbean Region (111 EX/5)

1. Considering that the General Conference, at its twenty-first session, requested the Director-General to organize in 1981 an intergovernmental meeting on the objectives, strategies and methods of action for a major project in the field of education in the Latin American and Caribbean region,
2. Recalling the terms of decision 5.2.3 by which the Board at its 110th session drew up the list of invitations to that meeting,
3. Having examined the request made by the Government of the Netherlands that the Government of the Netherlands Antilles be invited to that meeting,
4. Decides that an invitation to take part in the meeting with the right to vote shall be extended to the Government of the Netherlands Antilles.
