**RELATIONS WITH NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS,  
FOUNDATIONS AND SIMILAR INSTITUTIONS**

**SUMMARY**

In pursuance of 164 EX/Decision 7.3 and in accordance with the *Directives concerning UNESCO's relations with non-governmental organizations* (NGOs) adopted by the General Conference at its 28th session in 1995 and amended at its 31st session (Section V and Section II, paragraph 5.1), and the *Directives concerning UNESCO's relations with foundations and similar institutions* adopted by the General Conference at its 26th session in 1991, the Director-General informs the Executive Board of his decisions on admission to operational relations of NGOs and to official relations of foundations, and of his recommendations for reclassification of NGOs in informal relations.

## INTRODUCTION

1. The first evaluation of the implementation of the *Directives concerning relations with international non-governmental organizations* (NGOs), undertaken at the 164th and 165th sessions of the Executive Board (May 2002 and October 2002), served to take stock of cooperation with NGOs admitted to formal relations, and to renew their statutory relations accordingly.

2. As a follow-up to the implementation of the 1995 Directives, and in pursuance of Section II, paragraph 5.1 thereof, an evaluation exercise regarding cooperation with NGOs admitted to operational relations was launched at the close of the 165th session of the Executive Board in close consultation with the programme sectors. The results of that consultation are brought to the notice of the Board at its current session.

3. This document comprises two parts:

- Part I deals, on the one hand, with classifications and admissions of NGOs, foundations and similar institutions and, on the other, reports on the results and evaluation of cooperation with NGOs admitted to operational relations;
- Part II concerns the other issues relating to cooperation with NGOs, in particular their mobilization for the recent major conferences and international summits. In addition, this part of the document provides a brief survey of inter-agency cooperation in respect of NGOs, the work of the NGO-UNESCO Liaison Committee, and the fitting-out of the office space made available to NGOs by UNESCO in pursuance of 165 EX/Decision 8.8.

## I. CLASSIFICATIONS AND ADMISSIONS

### A. Classifications

4. The 1995 *Directives concerning UNESCO's relations with non-governmental organizations* stipulate (Section II, para. 5.1) that a complete absence of collaboration for a period of four years shall result in the automatic termination of operational relations. That period having elapsed for NGOs admitted to operational relations between 1996 and 1998, an evaluation of the cooperation engaged in under statutory relations of cooperation with these organizations was launched at the end of 2002.

5. The approach used for this exercise was to consult the programme sectors responsible for cooperation with NGOs from the substantive standpoint in their respective fields of competence for all NGOs admitted to this category. Following that consultation, which concerned 217 NGOs (the list is contained in **Annex I**), the Secretariat also contacted directly those NGOs that appeared to have developed working relations on a limited or inadequate scale since their reclassification or admission between 1996 and 1998. Following these consultations, recommendations were made for relations to be continued on an informal basis with 18 NGOs (the list of these NGOs is contained in **Annex II**) or, through their affiliation to an appropriate international NGO in formal relations, in the case of five NGOs (**Annex III**). However, it should be recalled that such relations may be reviewed at any time in the light of a development or strengthening of cooperation with the programme sectors.

6. In the same context, it seems difficult to continue cooperation with the **International Association of Art** (IAA), whose intrinsic usefulness is not in doubt but which no longer fulfils its mission in current circumstances, as a result of major structural difficulties inherent in its operation. So long as this NGO fails to settle its internal problems, it would be wise for the time being to defer

any decision to renew operational relations, and to maintain its status provisionally, pending clarification of its internal situation, until the next spring session, in 2004.

7. Moreover, it should be stressed that this document reflects the analysis of the replies from the programme sectors received up to 30 January 2003, the date on which the document was sent to the printers. Depending on the replies received after that date, and having regard to the statutory deadlines, an addendum will be prepared or, if appropriate, a supplementary document will be submitted to next year's spring session.

## **B. Admissions**

### **(a) International non-governmental organizations**

8. The Executive Board is informed at this session of decisions on admission to **operational relations** taken by the Director-General in respect of three NGOs which in recent years have established close and fruitful working relations on a regular basis. These organizations are:

- the **International Association of Academies of Science (IAAS)**, which brings together the academies of sciences of the countries of the Commonwealth of Independent States, and which has the potential to make a valued contribution on such topical issues as the use of the new information technologies and bioethics;
- the **Canadian Centre for International Studies and Cooperation (CECI)**, which works for development, in particular to combat poverty and to promote capacity-building among the organizations concerned in developing countries. Its admission to operational relations ties in with UNESCO's concern to associate the representatives of civil society with its action by encouraging exchanges between NGOs in the North and those in the South.
- the **International Astronautical Federation (IAF)**, a long-standing partner of UNESCO, which had enjoyed former category B status and whose relations were continued on an informal basis following internal restructuring.

The corresponding individual fact sheets of these three NGOs are presented in **Annex IV** of this document.

### **(b) Foundations and similar institutions**

9. With regard to foundations and similar institutions, the Board is informed of the admission to official relations of two foundations:

- the **City of Peace Foundation (UNIPAZ/UNIPAIX)**, which is a federation of organizations actively engaged in education for peace, and which publishes works and organizes numerous specialist workshops and seminars in this field. The corresponding individual fact sheet is presented in **Annex V** of this document.
- The **Foundation for UNESCO – Education for Children in Need**, which, in line with UNESCO's objectives and in close cooperation with the German Commission for UNESCO and the Secretariat, aims to promote the education of children and adolescents in difficulty and to provide for the basic needs of children who are disadvantaged and/or the victims of conflicts and natural disasters.

## **II. ADDITIONAL QUESTIONS RELATING TO COOPERATION WITH NGOS**

### **A. Participation by NGOs in the Eighth Conference of Ministers of Education of African Member States (MINEDAF VIII) (December 2002 – Dar es Salaam, United Republic of Tanzania)**

10. The non-governmental organizations of the Africa region mobilized and participated in the MINEDAF VIII process. They presented a high-quality official document on the challenges involved in the “Education for All” objective in Africa. The document had been ratified on the occasion of the Regional Consultation of African NGOs (September-October 2002, Lilongwe, Malawi), which in addition appointed representatives to be responsible for alerting the authorities concerned to MINEDAF VIII follow-up activities. A special session bringing together government representatives (Ministers et al.) and NGOs was organized during the ministerial conference as one of its subsidiary activities. That meeting gave rise to a fruitful exchange, and provided an airing for the expectations and concerns of each of the parties involved, thus highlighting the importance of strengthening dialogue and mutual cooperation.

11. In addition, the MINEDAF VIII Final Declaration reasserted the necessity and importance of associating civil society, regarded as an added value, with government resources.

### **B. Mobilization of NGOs to prepare the World Summit on the Information Society (Geneva, December 2003; Tunis, 2005)**

12. During the past months, UNESCO has pursued its close cooperation with the NGOs concerned with a view to preparing the World Summit on the Information Society. For this purpose, a meeting was held at UNESCO Headquarters on 27 and 28 November 2002, which was attended by NGO representatives and the Chairperson of the Summit’s Preparatory Committee, in order to agree on procedures for carrying out a wide-ranging online consultation of NGOs. This facility was set up and conducted from 9 December 2002 to 15 January 2003, with the registration of over 300 participants. A report containing the gist of the proposals formulated is currently being drafted. It will be addressed to the Secretariat of the Summit as a collective NGO contribution for the purpose of preparing the draft Declaration and Plan of Action that will be submitted to Member States at the second meeting of the Summit’s Preparatory Committee (Prepcom II – Geneva, 17-28 February 2003).

### **C. NGO contribution to the Porto Alegre World Social Forum (Brazil – January 2003)**

13. UNESCO joined hands with key civil society partners active in the field of education to organize the annual meeting of the Collective Consultation of NGOs in Education for All (CCNGO/EFA) on the theme “Towards Comprehensive Visions and Approaches to Education for All” in Porto Alegre, 19 to 23 January 2003, on the eve of the third World Social Forum. In accordance with the objectives related to the development of EFA National Action Plans, 120 NGOs from around the world, members of the UNESCO-NGO Collective Consultation in Literacy and Basic Education assessed civil society participation in the education planning processes and discussed alternative thinking and practices in education and their relevance to quality education and social change. The meeting also presented an opportunity to consult civil society on major initiatives, including the International EFA Monitoring Report, the United Nations Literacy Decade and the CONFINTEA V Review on Adult Learning (International Conference on Adult Education).

**D. Cooperation on NGO related issues with other international agencies:**

14. As a follow up to a meeting that UNESCO hosted in Paris in June 2002, the Organization in cooperation with the United Nations Non-Governmental Liaison Service (NGLS) and the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) is holding an informal meeting in Geneva with the participation of NGO focal points across the United Nations system, international development banks and other relevant international organizations. This meeting is expected to make a contribution to the work of the United Nations Secretary-General's High-Level Panel set up to review the United Nation's relationships with civil society. The Organization is also represented through its NGO Section in the Programme and Coordination Meeting (PCM) that is organized by NGLS prior to the informal meeting mentioned above.

**E. Proceedings of the NGO-UNESCO Liaison Committee**

15. During its enlarged meeting, the Committee organized on 29 November 2002 a brainstorming session on the topic "Cultural heritage: a vector for peace and sustainable development" with the assistance of the Culture Sector. One hundred and ten NGO representatives shared their experiences and pooled methods of action to meet the coming challenges, and reflected on how the NGO community might best be prepared for these challenges.

**F. Office space made available to NGOs by the Organization**

16. Pursuant to 165 EX/Decision 8.8 (October 2002) inviting the Director-General to transfer the NGOs accommodated by the Organization to Building VI bis, in cooperation with the NGO-UNESCO Liaison Committee, all but three of the NGOs concerned have been moved to the so-called "NGO House" building. At the time of writing, the transfer of one of these three NGOs (International Council of Museums) was scheduled for the beginning of the year. Negotiations are currently under way to undertake the transfer of the last two NGOs that are also to occupy Building VI bis: the International Council for Philosophy and Humanistic Studies (ICPHS) and the International Council for Film, Television and Audiovisual Communication (IFTC).

**DRAFT DECISION**

17. After examining this document, the Executive Board may wish to adopt a decision along the following lines:

6. Decides to continue relations with the following NGOs through their affiliation to an NGO in formal relations:

- International Association of Literary Critics
- Maison Internationale de la Poésie  
through the International PEN
- International Amateur Theatre Association

- Union Internationale de la Marionnette  
through the International Theatre Institute
  - Fédération Internationale Musique Espérance  
through the International Music Council;
7. Takes note of the decision to defer renewing operational relations with the International Association of Art (IAA) and to maintain its status provisionally pending clarification of its internal situation.

Aims:** to coordinate the work of researchers and to promote the search for solutions to general development problems; to promote cooperation in basic research; to bring more closely into line the research activities of academies of science; to support the most promising studies; to facilitate the joint use of costly research installations.
- 4. Fields of interest:** Scientific research, social and human sciences.
- 5. Geographical representativeness**

Members: IAAS is a network of researchers grouping together the following academies of sciences of East European and Asian countries and one observer from the Slovak Academy of Sciences: Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Republic of Moldova, Russian Federation, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Ukraine, Uzbekistan, Viet Nam.

**6. Internal structure**

Governing body: the Council, composed of 15 members, nationals of the following members of the Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS): Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Republic of Moldova, Russian Federation, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Ukraine, Uzbekistan, Viet Nam.

The Association's Council is the supreme decision-making body. It is composed of representatives of all member academies, a President and a Vice-President, elected by the Council for a five-year term, the Vice-President being designated on the proposal of the President. The Council meets once a year in ordinary session. A Praesidium secretariat, set up by the Council, is responsible for carrying out the decisions and activities decided upon at the statutory meetings. Between Council sessions, the standing or ad hoc committees, set up to engage in substantive discussions, meet as frequently as is necessary.

**7. Funding:** The financial resources of the Association derive from members' subscriptions, voluntary contributions from benefactors, and subventions from various organizations, societies, foundations, enterprises and firms.

**8. Activities**

**Main activities:** IAAS engages in activities designed to keep up a constructive dialogue with the authorities of the countries of the Commonwealth of Independent States and with their intergovernmental agencies in order to support the development of international scientific cooperation within the Commonwealth. It also organizes international conferences and seminars on topical issues, such as protection of intellectual property and technology transfer. For this purpose, the Association has set up a "Consultative Board" responsible for such questions. IAAS is also

active in international research programme development, in particular in the field of environmental protection and powder metallurgy.

**Cooperation with UNESCO:** IAAS, an organization composed essentially of academies of sciences of the CIS countries, represents the rebirth of the Academy of Sciences of the former USSR. Since its foundation in 1993, it has enabled a common scientific space to be created, providing an opportunity for all the academies to consult together and pool experiences, and to cooperate with international bodies. UNESCO's first contacts with this organization date from early 1995, before the adoption by the General Conference at its 28th session in 1995 of the *Directives concerning UNESCO's relations with non-governmental organizations*. It was proposed that IAAS establish official relations with UNESCO through its affiliation to the International Council for Science (ICSU). Since that period, IAAS and several of its member academies have taken an active part in the implementation of UNESCO programmes in the field of science. It took part in the preparatory activities for the World Conference on Science (Budapest, Hungary, 1999), and plays a major role in ensuring follow-up to it. A cooperation agreement was signed with two of its member academies: those of Belarus and the Russian Federation. In 1998 it organized, as a prelude to the Budapest World Conference on Science, an international conference on the theme of the "transformation of scientific systems in countries in economic transition".

The Science Sector, with which the Association has cooperated over the past five years, reports that the members of IAAS represent a significant part of the world's scientific community, making it one of the principal contributors to the advancement of world science.

**Decision by the Director-General:** Admission to operational relations and encouragement to extend its geographical coverage to all countries of Eastern Europe.

**CENTRE CANADIEN D'ETUDE ET DE COOPERATION INTERNATIONALE  
(CECI)**

**CANADIAN CENTRE FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDIES AND COOPERATION  
(CECI)**

- 1. Headquarters:** Montreal, Quebec (Canada)
- 2. Year founded:** 1958, incorporated in its present form in 1968
- 3. Aims:** The Centre's mission is to fight poverty and exclusion by strengthening the development capacities of disadvantaged communities, through support for initiatives to promote peace, human rights and equity, to mobilize resources and to encourage the pooling of know-how. It is committed to combining skills, humanism and voluntary service; to fostering populations' capacity to control their own social and economic development; to contributing to the building of democracy; to promoting equity and gender equality; to providing humanitarian aid to disaster-stricken communities; to giving priority to partnerships and strategic alliances.
- 4. Fields of interest:** The struggle against poverty, economic development, human rights, citizenship and democracy, social development, humanitarian action and reconstruction on behalf of disadvantaged partners and populations.
- 5. Geographical representativeness**

CECI maintains offices in 20 countries throughout the world, and has 500 members of all nationalities. Its membership also includes some 100 volunteers from various sectors of Canadian civil society.

**6. Internal structure**

The Board of Directors, composed of 10 members elected by the Annual General Meeting.

The Executive Committee, composed of the Chairperson, the Vice-Chair, the Treasurer and the Secretary and Executive Director, elected by the Board.

General policy is determined by the Annual General Meeting, which brings together all members of the Corporation. The active members are the voting members. Once elected, the Board elects from among its members the Chairperson, the Vice-Chairperson, the Secretary and the Treasurer. Together with the Director-General, they form the Executive Committee.

CECI is composed of:

- a cooperative centre, responsible for regional development programmes and humanitarian aid and reconstruction projects. It is made up of headquarters management teams and overseas offices;
- a training, study and advisory centre operating as a consultancy office, made up of a team of specialists.

The corporate components comprise general management, human resources, fund-raising, the education of and participation by the Canadian public in international development, administrative and financial services.

**7. Funding:** CECI finances derive essentially from subventions, of which 30% are from non-Canadian sources, fund-raising and subscriptions.

## **8. Activities**

**Main activities:** CECI conducts development schemes in over 35 countries throughout the world. The Centre has supported over 500 organizations in the South, and implemented 150 large-scale projects. It employs some 2,000 volunteers and Canadian aid personnel working with local partners.

CECI works in partnership with local organizations in order to enhance the work of civil society. It also collaborates with bilateral and multilateral cooperation agencies, regional banks, public bodies, private firms, institutional donors, charitable and specialized foundations and international NGOs.

Acting in support of local initiatives in Africa, Asia, Eastern Europe and the Americas, including Canada, CECI uses its expertise in economic development, human rights, citizenship and democracy, social development, humanitarian action and reconstruction to help disadvantaged partners and populations. It makes its expertise available through its training, study and advisory Centre (CFEC), which provides technical and methodological back-up in specific areas.

In the sphere of social development, in the light of the results of the World Summit for Social Development (Copenhagen, Denmark, 1995), CECI has developed an approach which takes the form of involving local non-profit organizations specializing in education or health care as value added in relation to government services. In recent years, CECI has conducted projects in this field in nine countries of Africa, Asia, Latin America and the Caribbean as well as in Canada.

CECI works actively in the field of human rights and democratic development, and its strategy for equitable development is to associate and mutually strengthen economic development, social development and the development of democracy. In this field, large-scale projects have been conducted in 13 countries of the South.

Economic development and the fight against poverty represent one of the major facets of the range of activities conducted by CECI, which seeks to provide the maximum number of people with opportunities for taking a direct part in the production of goods and services for which there is a solvent demand.

CECI has organized over 750 training sessions, seminars or symposia, and workshops in developing countries. Some 20 studies and specialized publications have also been produced.

**Cooperation with UNESCO:** Over the past years, CECI-Asia has been working alongside UNESCO in the field of media and communication. It has placed and/or facilitated Canadian aid personnel with a number of local organizations that are also UNESCO partners, notably local Radios in Nepal, Sri Lanka, India, and the Cambodia Communication Institute and the Women's Media Centre in Cambodia. Through informal cooperation, these contacts have produced a positive working relationship based on complementary strengths: UNESCO in the area of innovative projects development, and CECI in terms of technical expertise and field support. On two occasions, UNESCO has drawn upon experts in this network, as specialists in media and Information and Communication Technology (ICT) for development. Another expert was also placed by CECI in the UNESCO Office in Hanoi to deal with culture issues.

Although national in terms of structure, the international scope of its activities largely offsets the limited geographical range of its members. Its action on behalf of NGOs at grass-roots level, and its participatory approach to development activities, combine to make its network a key partner in the

implementation of cross-cutting themes. CECI could also contribute to the different capacity-building initiatives of NGOs operating in the field.

**Decision by the Director-General:** Admission to operational relations.

**INTERNATIONAL ASTRONAUTICAL FEDERATION  
(IAF)**

**FEDERATION INTERNATIONALE DES ASTRONAUTES  
(FIA)**

- 1. Headquarters:** Paris (France)
- 2. Year founded:** 1951, registered in 1972
- 3. Aims:** Foster the development of astronautics for peaceful purposes; encourage the widespread dissemination of technical information concerning astronautics; stimulate public interest in and support for the development of all aspects of astronautics through the various media of mass communication; encourage participation in astronautical research or other relevant projects by national and international research institutions, universities, commercial firms and individual experts.
- 4. Fields of interest:** Organization of and/or participation in international astronautical congresses, symposia, colloquia, workshops, scientific meetings, researches on space and publications.
- 5. Geographical representativeness**

Membership: The IAF is a non-governmental association, with members drawn from the public sector, industry, professional associations and learned societies from all over the world. It has 152 members from 45 countries.

**6. Internal structure**

The General Assembly is the supreme governing body. It is composed of the delegates of all members of the Federation. It holds plenary meetings annually and determines the policy of the Federation by general agreement or by voting of the majority of all voting members.

Governing body: The Bureau is composed of members from different countries: China, Czech Republic, France, Germany, India, Japan, Morocco, Mexico, Norway, Russian Federation, Sri Lanka, Switzerland, United Kingdom, United States of America, and consists of Elective and Appointed Officers. The Elected Officers of the Federation are the voting members: i.e. the President and the eight Vice-Presidents. The Appointed Officers are: the General Council, the Honorary Secretary and the Executive Director; that are non-voting members.

The Secretariat is composed of an Executive Director, an Administrative Assistant and a Secretary.

The Finance Committee examines the annual budget of the Federation and makes recommendations on financial improvement. The Committee is chaired by a member of the Bureau.

The International Program Committee (IPC) organizes the annual International Astronautical Congress.

The Congress Committee created in 1996 to increase the significance of the annual International Astronautical Congress and to improve the coordination.

The Committee for Liaison deals with relations with international organizations and developing nations.

The Technical Activities Committee is a body which develops guidelines for the IAF technical activities.

**7. Funding:** About half of the budget of the Federation is derived from the annual membership dues, the other half comes from the IAF's share of the registration fees paid by the participants of the annual International Astronautical Congress and from other activities such as Specialists' Symposia and donations.

## **8. Activities**

**Main activities:** Together with its associates, the International Academy of Astronautics and the International Institute of Space Law, the IAF organizes an International Astronautical Congress, which is held each year in a different country.

The International Astronautical Federation also organizes other symposia, workshops and events around the world. In close cooperation with the United Nations, it organizes an annual space Workshop for developing Nations such as those at UNISPACE III. With the Committee on Space Research (COSPAR) of the International Council of Scientific Unions (ICSU), maintaining formal associate relations with UNESCO, the IAF prepared the second World Space Congress (Houston – Texas (USA), October 10-19, 2002).

The IAF, together with the Committee on Space Research and the International Institute for Space Law, also conducts an annual survey of highlights in Space for the United Nations.

**Relations with International Organizations:** The IAF has established close relations with the World Health Organization (WHO), the World Meteorological Organization (WMO), the International Telecommunication Union (ITU), the Union of International Technical Associations (UATI) and other organizations concerned with astronautics and related fields.

**Cooperation with UNESCO:** The IAF initially admitted to the former Category B, was given informal relations status with the adoption of the new Directives in 1995.

Since then a fruitful and substantial cooperation has developed over the last few years, ranging from the field of natural hazards, to the field of Global Observation, Space and Education, and Ecology and Natural World Heritage Site Monitoring.

In addition, there is more active participation in IAF annual congresses, where UNESCO staff participates as session conveners, "rapporteurs" of scientific committees and exhibit organizers. A special effort was made for UNESCO to participate in the "World Space Congress" (Houston, Texas, 10-19 October 2002).

The cooperation between UNESCO and United Nations bodies is also being strengthened via the collaboration with IAF, especially with the United Nations Office of Outer Space Affairs (UNOOSA). Next year, an educational workshop will be organized in UNESCO Headquarters with IAF on the secondary education curricula development in the fields of Space Science. Finally the cooperation with different space agencies will be reinforced through contacts with IAF and its network of scientists, engineers, educators and policy makers.

**Decision by the Director-General:** Admission to operational relations.

**1. Headquarters:** Brasilia (Brazil)

**2. Year founded:** 1988

**3. Aims:** The Foundation contributes to the culture of peace by establishing a new model of education for peace, “the art of living in peace”, which takes account of three aspects of culture: individual culture, social culture and ecological culture. It networks under the UNIPAZ/UNIPAIX label, ensuring coordination and support. It also administers and directs the International Holistic University of Brasilia.

**4. Fields of interest:** Culture of peace, education for peace, transdisciplinary studies with a holistic focus.

**5. Geographical representativeness**

Members: the UNIPAZ/UNIPAIX network is currently composed of 28 units, of which 10 are in the form of “campuses” (associations organized on a legal footing) and 18 in the form of “delegations” (newly created associations or associations currently being set up). UNIPAZ/UNIPAIX units are to be found in the following countries, in the form of associations or non-profit foundations: Argentina, Belgium, Brazil, Ecuador, France, Israel, Portugal. There is a federation of European associations (UNIPAIX Europe, whose statutory name is EUROPAIX) and a federation of South American associations (UNIPAZ South America).

**6. Internal structure**

General policy is decided by the Network Board, which meets twice yearly. Each meeting is hosted by a different network unit. All units are recognized by the City of Peace Foundation through a formal agreement defining their limits and principles of action. They each have their own statutes and are responsible for their funding. Each unit is composed as follows:

- (a) a general assembly meeting at least once a year examines the activity report submitted by the Board of Directors and takes stock of UNIPAIX/UNIPAZ activities in the world.
- (b) the Board of Directors is formally responsible for the programme of action, that is, for designing and ensuring compliance with the curriculum. The term of office of its members ranges from two to four years, depending on the country.

**7. Financing:** the Foundation’s annual resources consist of donations (from individuals and institutions, both private and public, national and international), subventions and other contributions deriving from contracts and agreements and income from activities.

**8. Activities**

**Main activities:** The City of Peace Foundation coordinates and supports the network of units structured by UNIPAIX. Its main activity is to organize training courses, in the form of lecture cycles, short seminars, congresses and a longer (three-year) programme. The cornerstone of the

programme is the course on *The Art of Living in Peace*, published by UNESCO. An estimated 14,000 people have taken part in these activities, of whom 12,000 in South America and 2,000 in Europe. At present, the activities cover three regions of the world: Latin America (23 units), Europe (four units) and the Near East (one unit). Preparations are under way to develop activities in Africa also.

As part of its activities, major education for peace projects have been successful in Europe and Latin America, as for example the Beija Flor project aimed at supporting UNESCO's culture of peace programme by spreading the "Art of Living in Peace" method in Brazil and throughout the world, or again the establishment of a nursery or primary school, known as the "Casa do sol", in which children use the four elements (earth, water, fire, air) in order to forge their own learning skills in a process involving not only the mind but also the emotions, sensibility and intuition.

As regards the media, reports published via the Internet, radio, television, magazines and newspapers, notably the transdisciplinary holistic review *META* supported by UNESCO in Brazil, enable messages on education to be disseminated to a broad public.

**Cooperation with UNESCO:** Cooperation with the UNIPAZ/UNIPAIX network has been continuing for over 10 years, during which *The Art of Living in Peace*, prepared by UNIPAZ/UNIPAIX, was published by UNESCO.

Two partnership schemes have been conducted with the Education Sector:

- (i) UNIPAZ/UNIPAIX has been a member since 1998 of the "Planet Society", a network for the pooling of resources among associations, organizations and schools which has 5,000 members worldwide.
- (ii) It also collaborates with "Univers-Cité", a peace education programme targeted on young people in difficulty that carries out pilot projects in different countries: Brazil, Lebanon, France in 1999, United States and Philippines.

Among the wide range of its achievements, mention may be made of:

- the establishment of a Commission to prepare the UNESCO/UN International Year for a Culture of Peace in partnership with UNESCO's Brasilia Office;
- the award to the Foundation's President, Pierre Weil, of an honourable mention under the **UNESCO Prize for Peace Education** in 2000;
- the publication and reissue by UNESCO of *The Art of Living in Peace – Guide to education for a culture of peace*, in English and French, in a revised and supplemented version in the "Cultures of Peace" collection.

In recent years the UNIPAZ/UNIPAIX network has done more to disseminate its flagship programme "The art of living in peace", in particular by preparing a new booklet addressed to specific groups (the press, elected officials, holistic training personnel, educators and religious leaders), written in straightforward language, which summarizes the concept underlying this programme. The Foundation has also organized an increasing number of seminars aimed at specific groups and professionals. In terms of its scale and multiplier effect, the network federated by the City of Peace Foundation has continued to expand, in particular through the recent affiliation of the informal REDEDAPAZ network which plays a highly active role in implementing the Foundation's activities. The UNIPAZ/UNIPAIX network conducts actions in partnership with UNICEF, UNDP,

universities (the University of Peace in Costa Rica, the University of Peace in Namur, Belgium), NGOs and foundations (International Association of Lions Clubs, Rotary International) and national public institutions (Brazilian Ministry of Foreign Relations). The Department of Education for a Culture of Peace, with which it has conducted activities for over five years, supports its request to establish official relations.

**Decision by the Director-General:** Admission to official relations as a similar institution, under the *Directives concerning UNESCO's relations with foundations and similar institutions*.

**FONDATION POUR L'UNESCO – EDUCATION DES ENFANTS EN DETRESSE****FOUNDATION FOR UNESCO – EDUCATION FOR CHILDREN IN NEED**

**1. Headquarters:** Düsseldorf (Germany)

**2. Year founded:** 2002

**3. Aims:** The Foundation has been established to continue and expand the work accomplished by its founder, Ms Ute-Henriette Ohoven, as UNESCO's Special Ambassador for the Education of Children in Need. Its purpose is the direct and sustained promotion of education and satisfaction of basic needs of children and adolescents in particularly difficult circumstances, including street children, children who are exploited, disabled and affected by conflict and natural disasters. The Foundation works in line with UNESCO's constitutional goals, and in cooperation with UNESCO and the German Commission for UNESCO to identify suitable projects, provide financial support and assess their effectiveness and impact. The implementation of such projects is entrusted as a rule to UNESCO's field offices or National Commissions, in close collaboration with qualified local organizations.

**4. Fields of interest:** Education, human rights, health, nutrition, training for street children and disadvantaged urban youth, training for street educators, support to disabled children, preventive action and social reintegration, assistance to refugees and young victims of war and disasters, assistance to children in areas of extreme poverty.

**5. Geographical representativeness:** Projects funded by the Foundation extend to all Member States of UNESCO, and are to be undertaken primarily in developing countries. In the 10 years leading up to the establishment of the Foundation, funding has been provided for 189 projects in more than 80 countries: 39 in the Africa region, 24 in the Arab States, 28 in Asia and the Pacific, 58 in Europe (mainly in countries in transition), and 40 in Latin America and the Caribbean.

**6. Internal Structure**

The Governing Board (Kuratorium) has between three and 12 members (including the President of the German Commission for UNESCO and a representative of the Director-General of UNESCO), and is currently chaired by the Founder, Ms Ute-Henriette Ohoven (Germany). The Governing Board appoints the Directorate (two to three members), approves the annual programme and budget and ensures that the resources of the Foundation are used in accordance with its goals and objectives. The Directorate is responsible for the management of the Foundation's assets and donations and the preparation of its business plan and annual report. All members work benevolently for the Foundation.

**7. Funding:** The financial resources of the Foundation are constituted by its capital endowment and the benefits of its fund-raising activities, consisting of the income of the annual UNESCO benefit Gala in Germany, and of donations from the private sector in Germany and other European countries. It expects to be able to support UNESCO projects for the education of children in need to an average of €2 to 3 million per year.

**8. Cooperation with UNESCO:** since 1992, Special Ambassador Ohoven raised funding for UNESCO projects for an amount of €24 million. These projects are coordinated by the Education sector of UNESCO, under the extrabudgetary programme on "Education for Children in Need". For the period of July to December 2002, US \$530,000 have been received for the implementation of

**CORRIGENDUM**

1. Paragraph 5 of document 166 EX/38 should read as follows:

“5. The approach used for this exercise was to consult the programme sectors responsible for cooperation with NGOs from the substantive standpoint in their respective fields of competence for all NGOs admitted to this category. Following that consultation, which concerned 217 NGOs (the list is contained in **Annex I**), the Secretariat also contacted directly those NGOs that appeared to have developed working relations on a limited or inadequate scale since their reclassification or admission between 1996 and 1998. Following these consultations, recommendations were made for relations to be continued on an informal basis with 18 NGOs (the list of these NGOs is contained in **Annex II**). However, it should be recalled that such relations may be reviewed at any time in the light of a development or strengthening of cooperation with the programme sectors. Furthermore, the Secretariat will initiate consultations with five NGOs with a view to agreeing, by common consent, on how cooperation can be continued (**Annex III**).”

2. The draft decision in paragraph 17 of document 166 EX/38 should read as follows:

“17. After examining this document, the Executive Board may wish to adopt a decision along the following lines:

The Executive Board,

1. Having examined document 166 EX/38 and Corr.,

    - Union Internationale de la Marionnette
    - Fédération Internationale Musique Espérance
  - (c) the International Association of Art (IAA), which is maintained provisionally in operational relations, pending clarification of its internal situation, until the next spring session in 2004;
4. Further takes note of the Director-General's decision regarding the admission to operational relations of the following non-governmental organizations:
  - International Association of Academies of Sciences
  - Canadian Centre for International Studies and Cooperation
  - International Astronautical Federation;
5. Takes note also of the Director-General's decision to admit to official relations, as foundations:

- the City of Peace Foundation – UNIPAZ/UNIPAIX
- the Foundation for UNESCO – Education for Children in Need.”
